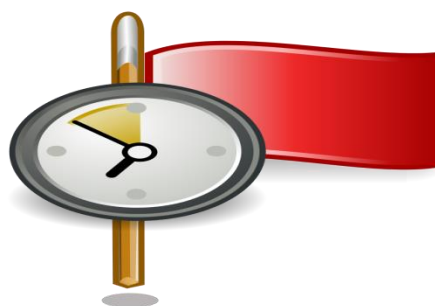

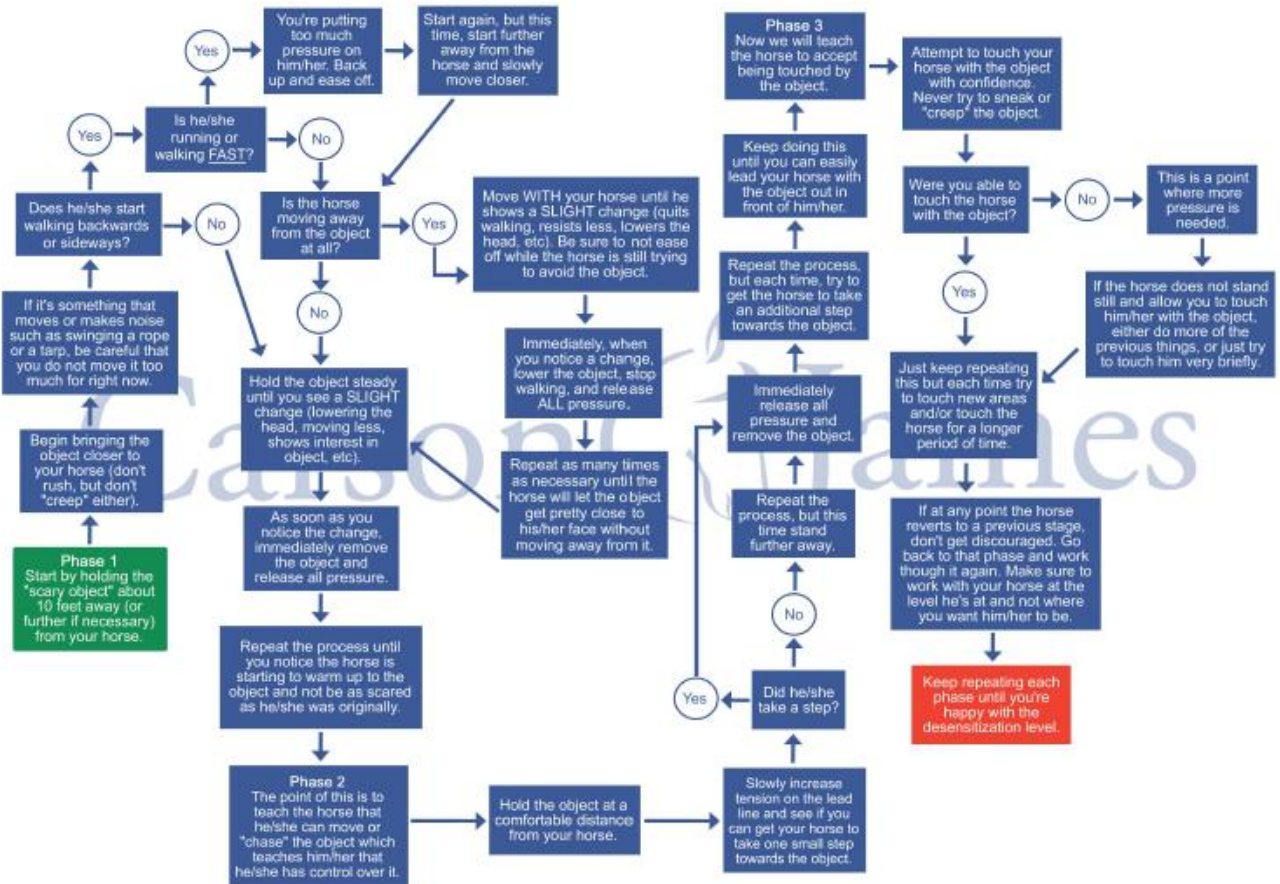

Always be aware that horses are not robots. Because of that, this flowchart is not 100% perfect, but it is pretty accurate. If you will pay attention and watch your horse closely to see which of the steps below he/she is currently at, this will work very well for you.


