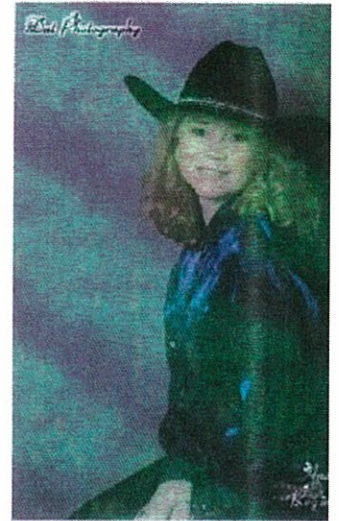
I am also very appreciative of Lewisville Saddle Club for stepping in and purchasing my banner and belt bu am very grateful. Thank you so very much.

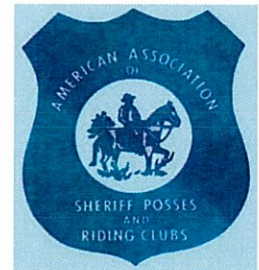
