Jack McClung

Community and church worker and friend to many, died Friday, Dec. 28, 2012. He was 97. A grandson once wrote "How can you make such a great life for yourself with nothing but your own motivation? This truly astounds me; I really admire you."

Born to Eva Mae and John Neill McClung in Fisher County on Oct. 2, 1915, he was named Calvin Weldon, but soon became "Jack." Because both parents died when he was very young, Jack lived and farmed with an uncle during depression and drought and later moved to Spur, Texas, to work as assistant manager to Safeway Grocery.

There he met his future wife, Lorene McArthur. They married in 1928, moved to Brady, then San Angelo. He worked for Safeway until he and his brother-in-law, Henry Mann, opened their own, independent Sunshine Grocery. Jack owned the grocery until retirement.

Jack and his wife, Lorene, were among the founding members of San Angelo Saddle Club. Jack loyally served in many club capacities including president and longtime board member. Jack four times served as president of the American Association of Sheriff Poses and Riding Clubs. In 1996, he was honored by the San Angelo Rodeo Association for loyal and lengthy service and installed as president emeritus of the AASPRC in 2005. He also received an award for never missing a single grand entry event by the Stock Show and Rodeo.

During these years Jack was active in the community serving in Optimist while enjoying fishing, hunting and family trips to the beach and mountains. Upon retirement Jack devoted more time to church, family and friends. As a longtime member of Park Heights Baptist he was active in Sunday school, hospital visits and countless food drops to ailing friends and church members. He continued to volunteer service to Baptist Memorials.



After recovering from a serious accident, Jack said, "I believe that God had something else for me to do." He began making brownies, first only a few platefuls. He soon was making 50 plates a week and giving them to his large community of friends. He became known as the "brownie man" and was recognized by the President's Volunteer Service Award.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Lorene McClung; and his son, Jack Edward McClung. He is survived by children Sherre Tankersley of San Angelo, Jode Johnson of Dallas and Neill McClung of Austin. Nine grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren also will greatly miss him. Funeral service will be held at 4 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 30, 2012, at in Johnson's Funeral Home chapel with a visitation to follow from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. In lieu of flowers please send donations to Baptist Memorials. Congratulations are in order for Jordan Johnson. On December 14, 2012 she graduated Texas A&M. She is on her way back home to attend law school.

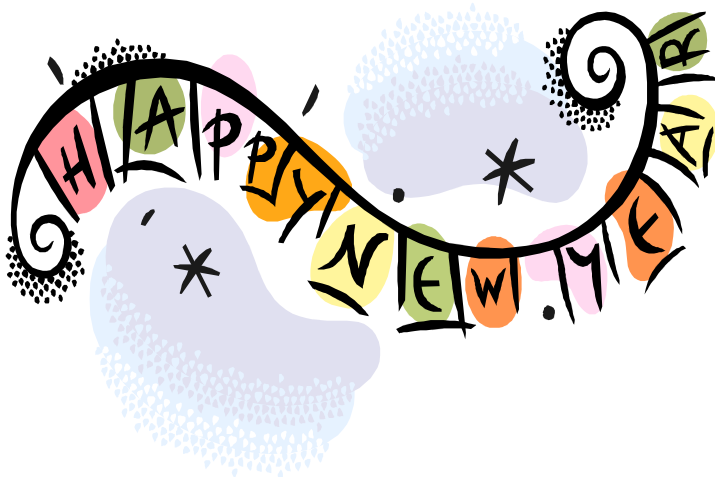

Our Playdays are the 1st Saturday of each month. January 26th we will have an open playday to support our Royalty starting at 9am sign up and ride at 10am.

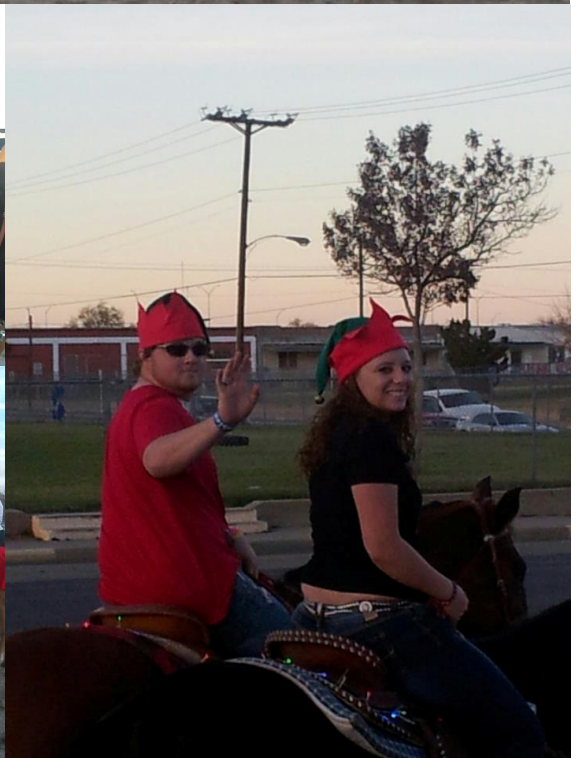
