

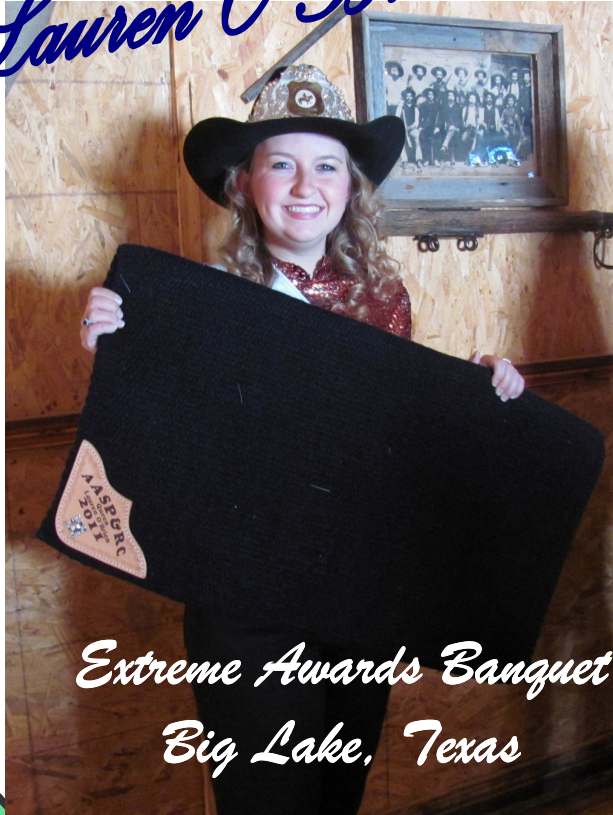

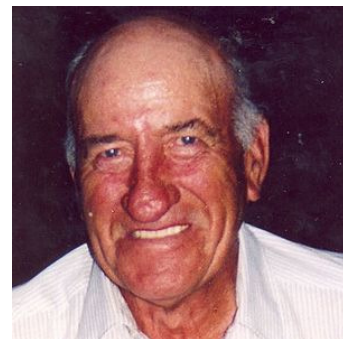
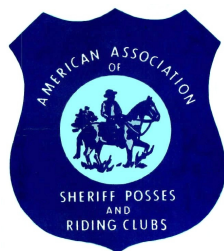
And after the parade, I'm always up for Joe T's or Mercardo!!!!

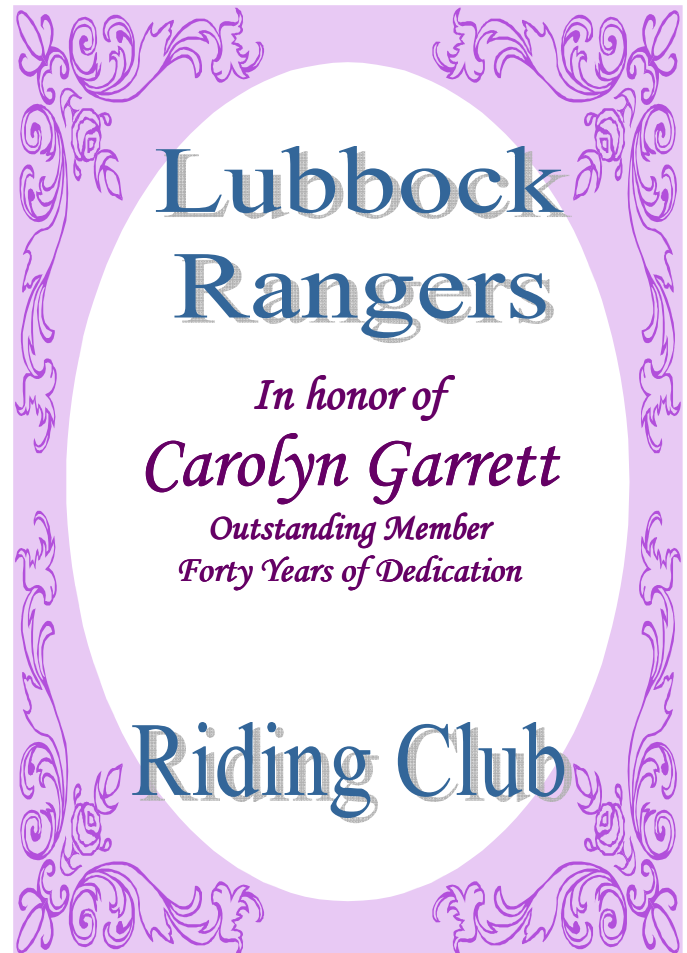
Remember: If participating in Ft. Worth Stock Show Parade you will NEED to have your CURRENT COGGINS!

A Tribute to Gene Montgomery



At the Lewisville Saddle Club Christmas Party on December 5th I was able to witness something pretty neat. For my Pawpaw's (Gene Montgomery) many years of service to Lewisville Saddle Club and in recent years taking care of our concession stand. In Lewisville we don't have hamburgers we have "Pawpaw Burgers". He was given a gift card to Cracker Barrel and also he was made a member of the LSC board FOREVER and given a Lifetime Membership to Lewisville Saddle Club. I don't recall another member of Lewisville Saddle Club ever receiving this honor. They were able to surprise him and as one of the hosts of his only surprise birthday party I know that is pretty hard to do.

As the first person to call him Pawpaw before anyone and everyone else did and being the one that he trained for my first complete sentence "I am so pretty because I look like my Pawpaw", I asked my Grandma to share some stories with me about the early days of their membership in Lewisville Saddle Club. The year the arena was built and the year they had the first Labor Day Rodeo, Pawpaw was president. He was one of the ten men that put their own names on the original note to borrow the money to build the arena. I have heard the story that all the wives brought their kids to the arena at night because the men spent all of their time at the arena to finish before the rodeo. There is a story that one night before the rodeo started a bull got out and all of the kids ran to the top of the bleachers while one of the men roped it. The original note was for \$1000 dollars and they took money on the street for admission to the rodeo so there is no telling how much money they lost but that first rodeo paid off that note.

When my grandparents joined in 1964 there was horseback square dance team and Pawpaw was on that. All of my life I have heard that will keep a horse in shape. They have many interesting stories from traveling with that group especially going to prison rodeos in Texas. Some of these people that are still around still say their bad knees are from square dancing on horseback. One time they were at a rodeo

and along with their routine, they set pivots for the Grand Entry and couldn't figure out where the Texas flag was. They forgot they were in Oklahoma!

In 1974 my grandparents became more heavily involved in the Association with my Aunt being Region 4 Princess. Back then there was a Region 4 that Lewisville Saddle Club belonged to before joining Region 5. I have only known them to miss one Playday Finals to this day. I have also heard that sometimes it is safer to run Pony Express than to judge it. I don't remember the exact story but I do know that Pawpaw and a group snuck out town late at night due to a losing pony express team looking for them.

Pawpaw served in several chairperson positions before becoming Executive Vice President in 1982 and 1983. People called him Walter Mondale because he didn't get to do much or say much. In 1984 he became AASP&RC President, this is where I start vaguely remembering stuff for myself and I am not totally relying on stories I have been told. My favorite part was him being an officer gave more access to the Queen and Princesses that I looked up to so much. He had to make the unpopular decision with the Executive Board that year to raise the association dues. I remember that I got to go with them on a lot of trips. Like at horseshow finals in Abilene and my mom and I were sharing hotel suite with Pawpaw and Grandma and I woke mom up to tell her there was a "munster" in the room (I was six). It was Pawpaw snoring, LOL!



In 1985 and 1986 he was Immediate Past president and still took that position very seriously and traveled. In 1986 I was LSC Mascot and got Ashes, the first horse I rode unassisted. So I got to go a lot and wear my pretty stuff like the big girls. When the time came for me to be one of those "big girls" and I was princess and AASP&RC Queen in 1996 Pawpaw was there with money for a hamburger, or to hold the video camera, or to take a camper to Bowie for the express purpose for me to change clothes in and cool off (back then PDF was still in July and there were no polo shirts). My queen year we had bad arenas at finals and my horse fell in Bowtie on the last day and the day before my mom had all but broken her nose when her horse fell. He was the first over the fence both times ahead of two paramedics that had been threatened that they had better come over the fence if something happened.

In 1999 we were at convention in Midland, TX and the association was in financial trouble. We were not even totally sure how we were getting out of the hotel with the bill paid. Pawpaw and I were sitting in the Delegates meeting together, I had been Queen's chairperson that year and it had been rough year. The subject we were on was how we were getting out of Midland. Pawpaw puts a \$100 bill in my hand says take this to Ron Brown who was Executive VP at the time. He told me to ask Ron to challenge the room to match it. Guess what, a continuous like headed toward Ron and I and we were collecting money. We got out of that hotel and we had some money to start the year 2000. In 2000 and 2001 Pawpaw was president again and I remember him scrimping to save every penny for the association so we didn't end up in the same situation. Mom and I thought we were traded in on a new family because they spent so much time in Bowie.

In 2009 when I was elected Region 5 Vice President I didn't get to be installed at convention because of a misunderstanding. I was a little disappointed about it but when I finally got to be installed in January it was more special that convention could have ever been. I

remember pulling into the gates in Bowie and looking at Eric and saying "what is Pawpaw doing here" ? Tommy McEwen had asked Pawpaw to come install me to make it special because I didn't get to do it at convention. I know for a fact I am the only officer ever installed by their grandfather who had also been an officer and held the same office. I have been able to look to him as an officer when I wasn't sure how to vote on something, even though I might not vote the same way he did and remember him as an officer when things get a little rough because I have always been committed to my Christian faith being apparent as I conduct myself as an AASP&RC officer.

I say all of this to say thanks to the Lewisville Saddle Club for making sure my Pawpaw will always remain a part of what we do even though now it is mostly watching us ride. The club is the basis for our whole association and that is where Pawpaw started with building an arena. I encourage other clubs to sit down and hear the stories of the older members and not only focus on changing things. Clubs need to consider honoring the older members even if they no longer ride because without them we wouldn't be here. Sometimes when Eric is talking about my Pawpaw he will slip up and call him Grandpa. I asked him why he did that one day and he told me that he reminds him of his Grandpa Savage and makes him not miss him so much. I feel very blessed to still have my grandparents at 32 as I know several of Pawpaw's club and Association friends have gone to Heaven like Dale Bryant, Bob Campbell, the Fraziers, and the hardest being Andi Lampier Geis, the one that he didn't mind that she didn't call him Pawpaw because she called him "House shoes" , he is still here going strong.

In Lewisville Saddle Club we are all blessed to have a Pawpaw.
