

One of my goals this year has been to add value to the grounds and make improvements to our grounds that we can all enjoy. I believe that we have a wonderful facility and we ought to be able to rent it out to others so that we can realize a situation where others "pay our bills".

One of the things that I had thought would be a very nice addition would be a cover for the slab. Spring Roundup put an exclamation point on the need for us to have a covered area where we could meet in a larger group. I have discussed the possibilities with the Officers and we have decided to move forward with this project. That being said, we are going to ask our members to become invested in this project if possible.

The following is a list of materials we will need to build this covering. Beside each item is the price of what one piece of that item will cost. If you see fit, please try to donate at least one piece of material to help us toward our goal. If nothing else, ANY donation of cash will be greatly appreciated.

This project will make it so much nicer for us at the grounds. I am hoping that when we complete this project, we can add lights and fans to make is so much nicer for us for awards presentations, dinners, dances and so forth. I have high hopes that if we all pull together and work diligently towards this goal, that we can complete this dream before Finals!

Total material cost \$6107.90

Please understand, metal prices fluctuate daily, so some of these material costs might fluctuate a small amount. But if we move forward quickly, they should be fairly close.

It will cost us approximately \$1800 labor to build the trusses off site and transport them to the arena. These trusses will be at the same angles to match the office peak, so the cover will be simply an extension of the current building.....

Total labor cost \$1800.00

Therefore, our total cost for construction of a cover on the slab will be approximately
......\$7907.90

I truly believe that this is a very achievable goal. If we all work together to reach the completion of this project, we can enjoy this improvement at Finals this year. Anything you can send in will be greatly appreciated. If you can donate the cost of a piece of R-panel, send in a check for \$67.75.....if you want to donate an upright post, send in a check for \$256.25....if you don't see anything that fits into your budget at the moment, try to send in \$20. Again, if we all work together, we can get this done and have something that we can all use and enjoy for years to come.

I am planning on working hard at this end to see if I can solicit some donations and lower our costs in this manner. There are lots of companies in the DFW area that carry metal, so keep your fingers crossed!!

And when we achieve this goal, I think we need to stop calling this area the "slab" and start calling it "the pavilion"!!! Between us all, we can do this, so LET'S GET COVERED!!!!!!!





As most of you know, the south side of our property has some pretty good Coastal Bermuda grass growing on it. In our continuing quest to raise additional funds for our operations, it has been suggested that we cut and bale the viable areas on the grounds and sell the hay produced. It is expected that we have between five and ten acres of viable Coastal to cut at this time....this area being between the two rows of barns and along the old track to the south side of the barns.

As a result, we are planning on cutting and selling this hay to any member who wishes to purchase it for their use. We are planning the first cut a week or two before Playday Finals and we will sell this hay at Finals for around \$5 a bale. If successful, a second cut is planned just before NARC Finals, where we will again sell to our members....or theirs. We will NOT fertilize the grass this year. Whether or not the areas are ever fertilized will be a decision to discuss in years going forward when we see if this program is a success.

Regarding who will cut this hay – we will take bids. We do have members that have their own equipment and we welcome anyone and everyone to bid this job. If you know someone that is a good prospect, please let them know they are welcome to take a look. We want to get the very best deal possible. It has been suggested that we find someone to cut on a percentage so that there will be no cash outlay by the Association....only the profits from selling what we have as a result.

SO......now there will be no need to haul hay from home when you come to Playday Finals. It will be available to you there on the grounds so you don't have to load and haul it from home. Hey—it's another WIN WIN!!! It's convenient for you and the Association profits! What a deal!!!

Be aware, the hay will be available on a first come first served basis, so if you decide you want to haul some back home with you when Finals are over, get there early and claim what you want!!!
