We would like to take a moment of your time to tell you a little bit about the American Association of Sheriff Posse & Riding Clubs. The AASP&RC is a family oriented not-for-profit organization of horse enthusiasts that was formed in 1952 with the motto "Horsemanship, Sportsmanship and Citizenship". The Association was formed to encourage the use of this motto and to keep alive the "Spirit of the Old West". Though we are a national organization, the majority of our members reside in Texas, New Mexico and Oklahoma at this time. Our organization is divided into 6 Regions; each region is divided into various districts and each district is made up of individual clubs. Our members are from all walks of life, of every age and economic circumstance and of every profession you can imagine. But we all share the same love of horses, family and friendly competition.

The major focus of our organization revolves around an equine speed sport called a playday. A playday consists of riders competing in a number of patterned events in one of fourteen classes that are aligned depending on age and gender...and our riders range from under 4 to over 70!! Often, there are three - and even four - generations of family members competing together at such a function. This is one of the only sports that we know of where you can join and compete at any age and together as a FAMILY - and that is truly unique! But playdays are not our ONLY focus. Our members also compete in barrel racing, roping, ranch and youth rodeos, shows, trail , drill, parades and all other sorts of equine activities.

The Association acquired a 40-acre facility in Bowie, Texas in the 1970s that serves as our home. Over the years, we have constructed two arenas, an office, a concession stand, RV hookups and 260 covered stalls. Our grounds are an ongoing "work in progress" and at this time, we are trying to raise funds for additional projects so that the property can be utilized in inclement weather. We hold several functions each year and many of our members travel hundreds of miles to attend these functions. Needless to say, the weather has interrupted these functions in the past and we would like to see if we can upgrade our facility so that the weather is not an issue.

In order to keep this wonderful organization alive and to achieve our end, we would like to see if your organization would consider buying some advertising space to help us along toward our goal. We are offering signage opportunities at our facility, advertising in our monthly publication (the Riders' Roundup), and advertising space in our function programs. I have known Jaime all of my life. I have many memories such as our grandparents setting up a little kiddie pool between their campers at playday finals for us to "swim" in and Jaime driving the golf cart with a ton of kids in it around the grounds in Bowie. I remember hearing a story of her taking her first airplane flight

on American Airlines and her asking a flight attendant if Hap (Hebb) was flying the plane (a former AASP&RC member who was a pilot for American). As we got older we were not as close as I chose the path toward becoming AASP&RC Queen but once we were grown we kept running into each other at Jack Ingram concerts and struck up a friendship again. I will never forget the day at a large festival concert in Fort Worth when she and I ended up backstage and she kept asking how I got us there. Needless to say we had a TON of fun. I can still hear her say one day at a playday in Denton when I was still an Intermediate rather than calling my name she said "you are still an intermediate"!

This is the first time in my life I have ever experience the loss of someone my own age. I have a cousin the same age as well that also knew Jaime and we both struggled. This has reminded me of how fragile life really is. The things we think are so important here on earth and things we hold on to really don't matter and life is too short. The things we think are so valuable here like houses, cars, and even horses are nothing compared to the reward of Heaven and rewards in Heaven. Right now we don't understand why such a tragedy happened but the Bible says that God's ways are not our ways and our understanding is not the same as His. I pray that we can all find comfort in knowing that God has a plan and pray for blessings out of such a tragedy. I especially pray for comfort for Kynlee and all of the Jeters, Rhodes, and Buckingham families. I am sure Jaime and Andi are tearing it up at the big playday in the sky.

As I stood there for two hours in the funeral home I saw a lot of people I have not seen in years or the last time I saw them it was at another funeral. I was thinking how sad it is that is takes a tragedy to bring us all together. We really shouldn't wait until times like that to get together and see how everyone is doing. I think we should try to do it on happy occasions even if we have to invent them.

On Valentine's Eve a group of friends and I all went to the annual Buffalo Dance to benefit Krum FFA kids. It was a lot of fun and a bit of a distraction from what we knew we would be facing later in the week. A lot of money was raised and I even got some neat stuff at the silent auction.

On Saturday, February 20th, I got on a horse for the first time in eight months (due to the broken foot last year). If you have known me for any length of time you know that fear is something I have to over come each playday season. So I was quite proud to get on and rode, and the horse was not even TJ. We finally made it to our annual charity playday at Lewisville Saddle Club after a slight detour into the Trail Dust parking lot on 380 to repair a blow out on the trailer. The crowd was small but it was a fun and relaxed day. You could definitely tell that the weather has made it to where nobody was able to ride much. The horses were a little wild eyed. It was quite entertaining to see people trying to remember how to do the Bowtie, I chickened out I was cleaning in the concession stand at that point and my horse was unsaddled.

This week we hope to bring TJ to my house so I can start getting that 8 months of weight off of him. We will see how that goes. I have two horses to ride this year. Before we know it Spring Round-Up will be upon us. I hope that everyone is working on getting a team together.

As most of you know, the south side of our property has some pretty good Coastal Bermuda grass growing on it. In our continuing quest to raise additional funds for our operations, it has been suggested that we cut and bale the viable areas on the grounds and sell the hay produced. It is expected that we have between five and ten acres of viable Coastal to cut at this time...this area being between the two rows of barns and along the old track to the south side of the barns.

As a result, we are planning on cutting and selling this hay to any member who wishes to purchase it for their use. We are planning the first cut a week or two before Playday Finals and we will sell this hay at Finals for around \$5 a bale. If successful, a second cut is planned just before NARC Finals, where we will again sell to our members....or theirs. We will NOT fertilize the grass this year. Whether or not the areas are ever fertilized will be a decision to discuss in years going forward when we see if this program is a success.

Regarding who will cut this hay – we will take bids. We do have members that have their own equipment and we welcome anyone and everyone to bid this job. If you know someone that is a good prospect, please let them know they are welcome to take a look. We want to get the very best deal possible. It has been suggested that we find someone to cut on a percentage so that there will be no cash outlay by the Association...only the profits from selling what we have as a result.

SO.....now there will be no need to haul hay from home when you come to Playday Finals. It will be available to you there on the grounds so you don't have to load and haul it from home. Hey – it's another WIN WIN!!! It's convenient for you and the Association profits! What a deal!!!

Be aware, the hay will be available on a first come first served basis, so if you decide you want to haul some back home with you when Finals are over, get there early and claim what you want!!!
