
Articles and Pictures for Publication

Hello from West Texas,



Ruby walked most of the events but did let her horse lope a little. I'm just pleased to have her back in the saddle after her surgeries.


Our next district will be in Hawley April 12-13. I hope we don't get rained out but I will not be too distressed if we do. Right now rain is about the highest thing on the priority list.



James "Jack" A. McEwen

James A. McEwen was born to Nathaniel and Beatrice McEwen on January 29, 1926 in Megargel, Texas and went home to the Lord on March 28, 2014 from Granbury, Texas.

Visitation will be from 2:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at Lunn Funeral Home in Olney on Sunday, March 30, 2014.

Graveside services and interment will follow at 4:00 p.m. at the Megargel Cemetery on Sunday, March 30, 2014, with Scotte Clark of Olney, officiating.

A lifelong resident of Megargel, Jack as he was known to most, was an accomplished horseman and avid hunter, be it quail, coyotes or rattlesnakes. Jack attended Megargel schools and served his country during World War II as Fireman 1st Class in the United States Navy. He was a pumper in the oil field until his retirement. Jack was a Lifetime member of the American Association of Sheriff Posses and Riding Clubs and participated in events until 4 years ago. In July of 1951, J. A. and Maryrae Fleming were married in Clovis New Mexico, and he returned to Megargel with his bride where they made their home for over 50 years.
