

Hi, my name is Wendy Vann. We are hosting our 3rd annual event that will benefit two great organizations, Cooks Children Center of Ft Worth and Life Gift Organ Donation Centers across Texas.

On October 16, 2011, I lost my 22 year old daughter to a rare illness that she had never even been diagnosed for called AVM - **Arterio-Venous Malformation.** Before that moment she had already made a big life choice to be an organ donor. What we didn't know was that one of the important people that were going to benefit from this choice was an 18 month old little boy named William. I found out the night before they took her in for harvesting that while we were at Harris Methodist of FTW, right next door at Cooks Children one of the recipients was waiting patiently. Although I was dealing with major grief of losing my child, my thought was also going out to the family next door and knowing that another family would not have to go through what I was because of my daughter's life choice.

Since this time, I have got to meet and talk to many of the recipients that my daughter helped save. I had a big choice to make –be angry at the fact God took my child and mother of my grandchild or use what had happened to make a difference and not let her death be in vain. I choose the latter. I started talking to both organizations and took what both my daughter and I love and decided to do something with this.

We are asking for your support in helping these organizations in a big way. We are hosting the 3rd annual, "SAVE A LIFE – RIDE A HORSE" benefit. Out of this Cook's Children's will receive new teddy bears, that will be given to children that are being admitted, and Life Gift Organ Donation Centers will receive 30% off proceeds made from this Jackpot to help with funding, research and the cost that goes into organ donations. 70% will be paid to entries, so no money is made by this event. Please help us make this happen. This is a 501c non profit association so your contribution will be tax deductible. A tax donation letter will be sent to your address for your records. 


PLEASE KEEP THE FOLLOWING POINTS IN MIND DURING JUDGING OF THE **RIDING GROUPS:**

**Members carrying the flag, leading the group or Sweethearts or Mascots MAY be dressed differently or have different horse equipment that the other group riders. THIS IS OK, \underline{DO} NOT subtract points in this case.

**The rest of the riding group should be consistent and alike or similar in their horse equipment and clothing. Example: If one rider has on black gloves, they should ALL have on black gloves, if not, then they deserve a reduction in points. Example: If some riders have on chaps, then all riders should have on chaps, or have points subtracted.

**If one rider has blackened hooves, then ALL members of that group should have blackened hooves, if not, then they deserve a reduction in points.

**If a rider has NOT groomed their horse well, then points should be subtracted. Typically, hairs around and on the face should be clipped or trimmed. Also, the lower part of the horses legs should be trimmed or clipped (see diagram). If a rider has not trimmed consistent with the other riders in their group, then points should be subtracted from their score.




From the south:

- Travel north on I-35W and take exit 24 (FM-1706/FM-3136/Maple Ave)
- At the stoplight, turn left to head west back under I-35; at that stoplight, turn right to head north on the I-35 access road (watch for traffic exiting off the highway!)
- Turn left onto FM 3136; stay on FM 3136 for approximately 1.3 miles and the arena is on the right

From the north:

Option 1 (recommended route)

- Travel south on I-35W and take the exit for Hwy 67. Turn left (east) onto Hwy 67.
- After approximately .3 miles, turn right (south) at the first stoplight onto N Parkway Dr/Business 35.
- Travel approximately 1.6 miles and turn right at the stoplight at County Road 401/Maple Ave
- Go under I-35 and turn right at the stoplight to head back north on the access road (watch for traffic exiting off the highway!)
- Turn left onto FM 3136; stay on FM 3136 for approximately 1.3 miles and the arena is on the right



Option 2

- Travel south on I-35W and take the exit 24 (FM-1706/FM-3136/Maple Ave) (the first exit after passing Hwy 67)
- After exiting, you will either have to make a right-hand hairpin turn to head north back onto the access road OR there is small gravel area on the right side of the access road that you may be able to turn around in (before the stoplight)
