Spring Round Up April 16-17-18 Get your Teams Ready to Rumble!!!!

Bubba was purchased by Renee Guthrie from BJ Parham on June 20, 2009 right after the last event at Playday Finals. Bubba passed from Colic on January 3, 2010 after a long trip to Dallas where his last performance was in the Cotton Bowl Parade where he was definately "the Champ" of the day! The day after the parade he was able to enjoy his last long trail ride, appropriately, in Bowie, Tx at Charmie's house accompanied by his complete family: Renee, BJ, Johnny, Annette, Bailey, Brianna, Deanne and Rhett. It was a GOOD day!!!! My Dearest Bubba...You were one of the all time greatest and we will miss you so very very much, God's speed my precious Angel!!!!



Bust to bring you up to speed:

.....As of this writing, we have received 20 option requests for RV spots. Again, no two members have requested the same spot, so everyone that has purchased an option on an RV spot has received their #1 requested spot! Total income to date is \$3000.00 (and counting...??).

.....We have received no additional correspondence from the IRS so we are still in a holding pattern regarding the 2005 Form 990 tax situation. We will have to pay a late filing fee for the 2008 Form 990.

.....We have sent the financial information for the 2009 Form 990 to our accountant and preparation of our taxes is underway. This form is not due until May 15, but we wanted to be proactive and get this in well before the deadline.

.....We are going to have to have a new pressure tank. We are working on getting cost information at this time for replacement of this item.

....We had an Executive Board Meeting on January 17. Look for the minutes to be published in the February Riders Roundup. At that meeting, we did adopt a new Queen's Contest Judging Form. An example of this form is included in this issue. We believe this new sheet will be an asset to the contest and assist the judges in calculating the proper scores for the candidates during the competition.

.....We have received an update regarding the Queen's trailer. It was reported in the last Riders Roundup that Mr. Ballard found no damage to the Queen's trailer during his assessment. He has since communicated the following to me "I just read the Rider's Round Up and I want to make a correction about the front axle under the Queen's Trailer. The right front spindle does have a <u>very slight</u> bend. That <u>slight bend</u> will not affect the safety or performance of the trailer. The <u>only</u> issue will be tire wear. Based on what I looked at, the tire wear is <u>very minimal</u>. In fact, <u>I could not see any tire wear or "dishing of the tread"</u>. If you weigh the cost of a new axle beam vs. <u>very minimal</u> tire wear I think a person would be way shead to hold off on a new axle and pull the trailer as is. If I owned the trailer, I would pull it as is and save the bucks. I was a lot more concerned about getting the wheel bearings packed so I donated 4 new seals and Garland repacked the wheel bearings." At this point, we will wait to see if there is an inordinate amount of tire wear before moving to replace the axle. I have also had a member that believes he might have an axle that would be sufficient and will research this avenue if need be in the future.

.....There was a meeting with the NARC&SP President earlier this month and the contract for holding their Finals at the grounds over Labor Day Weekend has been submitted to their Association. They have their second Convention later this month and where this document will be presented for approval. We are hoping that by this time next month we will have their deposit check in hand.

.....Remember to get those membership applications in quickly. After March 1, there is a \$25 late fee that will be tacked on the the normal \$60 annual membership dues (see in the Rulebook, Article II Section 5). All applications need to be made through your club secretary. Club secretaries, the packet from you containing the applications must be postmarked before March 1 to avoid these late fees.

.....Spring Roundup will be held April 16 - 18. This year, we will have a barrel race Friday night, a "Team Playday" on Saturday and a "Poker Ride" on Sunday, not to mention other new and funthings to participate in Look forward to the February Riders Roundup for scheduling and registration information.

.....Convention will be held in Wichita Falls this year at the Howard Johnson Plaza. More information to follow in later editions, but we are set for the dates of October 15 - 16. You can check out the hotel online. Looks like a pretty nice place!!! Region 2 will be hosting this year.

HELP THE ASSOCIATION AND YOUR POCKETBOOK!!

With the nature of the economy as of late and everyone having to tighten their belts, it has become increasingly difficult for our average member to afford to continue to participate in all of our activities. This affects the AASP&RC directly in many ways. When people cannot afford to come to Bowie, not only do they miss out on the fun, but the Association does not collect their entry fees, registration fees and such revenue that allow us to continue to operate as a whole.

For several years, the Association has had an incentive in place whereby you could ride for free at Finals if you sold \$150 worth of ads in either the Riders Roundup or the function programs. There have been some that have taken advantage of this program and others who I am sure were not aware that this program existed. By taking this idea and expanding it, it is my hope that this will afford our members some assistance in helping to lessen the strain on their checkbooks as well as add to the Association's bottom line!! Understand that this is NOT a requirement as not everyone has an aptitude for selling ads. But for those that will put forth the time and yes, the expense, that it takes to get out and hustle ads, it will reward them for their efforts. And for some that are financially strapped, participation in this program might allow them to participate in functions where they might not have the ability to do so otherwise.

In short, if you sell ads, you will earn credits that may be applied to your Association fees (such as event fees, registration, stall rentals, membership, etc) OR you may receive a prepaid Visa or Wal Mart card OR a combination of both. The achievement levels are as follows:

\$150 - free ride at Finals (\$40 value) \$500 or a saddle donation - 4 free rides @ Finals or credit for \$125 for Association fees or \$125 Visa/WM card or combination \$1000 - \$250 card or credit combination \$2000 - \$500 card or credit combination

IN ADDITION, as an additional incentive, the family with the highest amount of adsales (including the Princesses and their families), will receive an additional \$100 card/credit and recognition at Convention. For example, Joe Member and his wife and two kids belong to the Association. Joe sells \$2000 in ads. He decides instead of having this all on a prepaid Visa card, he would rather the four of them all get free rides at Finals (\$160 value), registration (\$40 value), 4 dinner tickets (\$40), his RV space for Finals(\$60) and get 4 stalls for the week (\$100). The rest he would like in the Visa card to help pay for gas, feed and food for the week. He has earned \$500 for selling the ads. We give him credit for the entry fees, registration, dinner tickets, RV space and stalls for a total of \$400 credit and then give him the \$100 remainder on a Visa card for gas and extras. Or he can hold it as a credit to apply to his fees at 50/50! His choice!!!

This way, if a family cannot afford Finals the traditional way, they have an option to sell ads to pay for all or part of their trip. This can be done for other events as well, can be used to pay for their membership dues and any other things we normally would charge for. The only thing we will NOT use this for would be for Concession charges. At this time, there is simply too much room for error in keeping track of a "tab" in the Concession stand with the number of people that work in there and would be responsible for properly accounting for the charges that are incurred.

Saddle donations will also be handled as a credit. When someone donates a saddle personally or goes out and gets a saddle donation from a business, it would be a credit of \$535 to their total. If this was the extent of the donation and there were no more ad sales, the credit would be worth the equivalent of 4 rides at Finals (\$40 each for \$160) or a \$125 Visa card. The only place where this would not be credited is for a saddle donation from a club, district or region.

There is no limit on the amount of ad sales that a person can sell....no ceiling to the amount that they can earn. The types of ads that are included would be event program ads (remember, the ads will run in ALL event program ads for the year), ads for the Riders Roundup and signage at the arena. As you sell ads, send them in immediately so that we might get them ready for publication as soon as possible. If a receipt is requested, please contact the office and one will be provided.



SO – if you are so inclined, get out there and sell, sell, sell. It's a win-win for you and the Association!!!

PayPal is here!! Use your credit/debit card to pay fees!!

As we promised, you can now pay your Association fees and such using your credit/debit card. It's easy! All you have to do is log on to the website and click on the "Dues/Fees" tab and shop away. You simply choose the event or fee that you are interested in, click on the drop down arrow and select each item that you wish to pay for and add it to your "cart".

When you have completed your "shopping", follow the easy to read instructions and submit the request and the monies will be transferred from your account to the Association account....simple as pie! Then and this is VERY IMPORTANT - print out the receipt.

Be aware, there is a small fee for this service which you will be responsible for. Also, you MUST print your PayPal receipt to present with any paperwork that you are required to submit to your club or district secretary to be sent in to the office for processing. As you are aware, your membership dues and event registration for Finals MUST come from your club or district secretaries respectively, so any time you use PayPal for these, you must present your payment receipt so the secretaries will know that you have already paid.

For example, say you want to pay your yearly dues. Access the website and click on the drop down arrow next to "AASP&RC Membership Payments" then scroll down to the amount you wish to pay. When you have completed the process, print out the receipt and take that receipt along with your membership application to your club secretary so that it can be sent in with the rest of your club's membership forms. Once we receive the paperwork from the club secretary, we will retrieve the payment from PayPal and all is complete.

Let me stress YOU MUST PRINT AND SEND IN YOUR PAYPAL RECEIPT WITH YOUR PAPERWORK. Without the receipt, we have no way of determining who sent in what and what it was for. It is IMPERATIVE that this step be followed.

We have added this to the website purely for the convenience of those who choose to use it. Utilizing the website for payment is NOT a requirement. Please take advantage only if you choose to. Also understand that this is a work in progress, so we welcome any feedback, both positive and negative, so that we might take any action necessary to "get it right". We are shooting for convenient and easy-to-use. Let us know how we've done.
