18, 2013, in Fort Worth. Service is 1 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 28, at White's Funeral Home, in Springtown, with Pastor Kemper Huber officiating. Interment will follow at Springtown Cemetery. Visitation is 6-8 p.m. Tuesday at the funeral home.

She was born Feb. 27, 1929, to Verna Mae Roberson and Herschal Spencer "Pete" Ward in Bailey, Texas. She married her high school sweetheart, Garland Hargis, on Feb. 20, 1948. They celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary this past spring.



Mrs. Hargis worked at the Fort Worth National Bank and was a loyal and valued employee there for more than 40 years. She and her husband participated in a square dance club for many years. 

A TRIBUTE TO SCOUT

Raymond's paint, Scout, a little Paint with a great big heart, passed away on August 10, 2013. Scout and was buried at our residence on the 4R Ranch near Bronte, TX. Scout was buried on the tallest hill of the ranch, known as John Wayne Hill.

Raymond first acquired Scout from an individual who was going through a divorce. The couple worked things out and got back together and Scout was sold back to that family. A short time later, after things didn't work out for that couple, Raymond reacquired Scout, but warned them that they would not get him back in the future.

Scout participated in many different type of events during his 33 years of life. Raymond and Scout won Hi-Point in their class for 20 years straight in District 5 Playdays, also winning awards at Playday Finals, and on the local level. After finishing the event and leaving the arena, Raymond would walk to the trailer, with Scout following up like a puppy dog. If Raymond stopped to talk, Scout would nudge him in the back to get him going, if that didn't work, Scout would just head back to the trailer and wait for Raymond to get there to give him his treat.

Raymond and Scout also loved the sport of Palmetto or Cowboy Polo, playing in 8 World Championship tournaments and often winning the Outstanding 2nd Forward award. Polo tournaments were held not only in San Angelo and other parts of Texas, but also in Alabama, Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Nebraska and Nevada.

Scout and Raymond entered 2 Horses Shows, winning Grand and Reserve, holding their own in the show part, but then blowing away the real horse show participants in the speed events to win the shows.

Scout also rode in a few parades, with the most fun one being the Christmas parade at Merkel, Tx, when Raymond tied a set of deer antlers to his bridle, to make him into a reindeer, the crowd loved it!

Years ago, the San Angelo Stock Show & Rodeo allowed members of the San Angelo Saddle Club (which we belonged to for over 30 years) to have a Pony Express race, and yes, Scout was also part of that fast paced fun event.

In 2009, Scout was awarded District 5's Outstanding Horse Award, by Buster Jones. Raymond retired Scout several years ago at the end of District competition at the Taylor Co. Arena, pulling off his saddle in the arena with Scout following him to the trailer. It was hard to find a dry eye in the crowd that day.



We are still selling those ads for our program so please contact Donna Rutledge, Jennie Brock or myself and we will get you the information listed in the program.


