

Help the Association and Your Pocketbook

With the nature of the economy as of late and everyone having to tighten their belts, it has become increasingly difficult for our average member to afford to continue to participate in all of activities. The affects the AASP&RC directly in many ways. When people cannot afford to come to Bowie, not only do they miss out on the fun, but the association does not collect their entry fees, registration fees and such revenue that allow us to continue to operate as a whole.



For several years, the Association has had an incentive program in place whereby you could ride for free at Playday Finals if you sold \$150 worth of ads in either the Rider's Round Up or the function programs. There have been some that have taken advantage of this program and it is not known if others knew it existed. By taking this idea and expanding it, the hope is that this will afford our members some assistance in helping to lessen the strain on their finances as well as add to the AASP&RC's bottom line! Understand that this is NOT a requirement as not everyone has the ability to sell ads. But for those that will put forth the time and yes the expense, that is takes to go our and sell ads, it will reward their efforts. And for some that are financially strained, participation in this program might allow them to participate in functions where they may not have the ability to do otherwise.

If you sell ads, you will earn credits to be applied to your Association fees (such as event fees, registration, stall rentals, membership, etc.) OR you may receive a prepaid Visa or Wal-Mart gift card OR a combination of both. The achievement levels are as follows:

- >\$150 free ride at finals (\$40 value)
- ➤\$500 or a saddle donation 4 free rides at playday finals or credit of \$125 for Association fees or \$125 Visa or Wal-Mart gift card or combination of card and credit for fees
- >\$1000 \$250 card, credit or combination of the two
- >\$2000 \$500 card, credit or combination of the two
- >\$2500 \$625 card, credit or combination of the two
- ▶ Platinum or Diamond Corporate Sponsorship \$1000 card, credit or combination of the two

IN ADDITION, as an additional incentive, the family with the highest amount of ad sales will receive and additional \$100 card/credit and recognition at convention in October.

For example, John Doe, his wife, and two kids belong to the AASP&RC. John sells \$2000 in ads. He decides instead of having this all on a prepaid Visa card, he would rather the four of them all get free rides at Playday Finals (\$160 value), registration (\$40 value), 4 dinner tickets (\$40 value), their RV space for finals (\$60 value), and 4 stalls for the week (\$100 value). The rest he would like on a Visa card to help pay for gas, feed, and food for the week. He has earned \$500 for selling the ads. We give him credit for the entry fees, registrations, dinner tickets, RV space and stalls for a total of \$400 credit and then give him the remaining \$100 on a Visa or Wal-Mart card. He could also choose to hold the \$100 credit and apply it to convention.

This way if an individual or a family cannot afford to pay for the trip to Bowie to Playday Finals in the traditional way, they have the option to sell ads to pay for all or part of their participation in AASP&RC functions. This can be done for all functions, membership dues, and any other things we normally collect a fee for. The only thing we will NOT use this for would be charges at the concession stand to avoid the bookkeeping nightmare it could pose due to the amount of people that work in there over the course of the various functions.

Saddle donations will also be handled as a credit. When someone donates a saddle personally or goes out and gets a saddle donation from a business, it would be a credit of the cost of the saddle to their total ad sales. If this was the extent of their donation and their were no more ad sales, the credit would be worth the equivalent of 4 rides at Playday Finals (\$40 each for \$160) or a \$125 Visa/Wal-Mart gift card. The only place this would not be credited is for a saddle donation from a club, district, or region will also not warrant signage at the grounds as an Ivory sponsor.

There is no limit on the amount of ad sales that a person can sell and no limit to the amount that a person or family can earn. The types of ads that are included are the function program ads that will run in all event program ads for the year, ads for the Rider's Round Up, signage for the arenas, and sale of corporate sponsorships. As you sell ads, send them in immediately so that they may be prepared for publication as soon as possible. If a receipt is requested, please contact the office and one will be provided.

After reading last month's edition of the Rider's Round Up, it became clear to me that I need to include an addendum to my January District 25 report. First let me begin by saying the suggestion that I am prejudiced toward ANYONE not the least of which, a person with a physical challenge is quite offensive to me. You see, my oldest brother was stricken with Polio as a child. From that sickness I've witnessed the "too many to list" surgeries he's undergone, all of which gave him no relief and left him with more than a noticeable limp. I've witnessed the pain, the courage and the determination in his face when someone told him he couldn't. I also witnessed the smile on his face when he showed them he could. I've witnessed the name calling, I've witnessed the isolation, I've witnessed the segregation, I've witnessed the prejudicial treatment. How dare ANYONE suggest that I am not sympathetic or empathetic to any human being. I support that statement like this. While you sleep... me and/or men and woman like me provide the VERY blanket of protection you enjoy. I've spent my entire adult life fighting for people who can't or don't want to fight. I've had people shoot at me with firearms as well as been spit on, hit, kicked, cussed at and been injured too many times to list. I believe my support of, as well as defense of ALL people is well documented. The issue with the magic saddles and being "overmounted" vs. a person with ANY type of disability are two VERY DIFFERENT issues!!! One has NOTHING to do with the other. The fact of the matter is this... IT IS this Association's business to get involved. It's NOT fair to the kids that are riding based on their own skill set and ability to ride a horse. It's NOT fair to set a child on a horse that will run a pattern on its own while the child basically holds on. It's NOT fair. Further, I'm not condemning those that use them. To each his own and EVERYONE is free to they compete. The use of magic saddles is NOT AGAINST the rules. I could choose to allow my child to use one, but I don't. That said, they are unfair and it IS the associations business to become involved in it.

Having said that, jumping to conclusions, making knee jerk reactions or forming conclusions based on less than the full facts is not very intelligent. Making accusations and assertions based on one side of the story or at the very least misinformation is foolish. I make a suggestion and get ridiculed and the like because I have an idea. What I'm doing is trying to stimulate some conversation. Maybe it's not the correct idea, maybe it needs to be thrown out and start over. Having said that, when one group shows up and is a "delegate(s)" for a club they aren't even members of, there is a problem. When someone finds a loophole to manipulate the outcome...I'm sorry, but I feel that is wrong. There are many other members who feel the same way. The good thing is, at least I got ONE person who was NOT going to participate to actually write and become involved be it Switzerland (In 1920, Switzerland joined the League of Nations, which was based in Geneva, on the condition that it was exempt from any military requirements) or Sweden. Then again, it's pretty easy to see why most people DO choose to be Sweden OR Switzerland. If you have an idea or thought you get pummeled publicly. So, people just don't become involved... go figure.

Well, almost a year has passed and still no definitive word on the Criminal Case on Donna Leipsic that does NOT exist. So, since there hasn't been anything to support what Donna allegedly did, let's talk about what she DID DO to and FOR the AASP&RC! Here's a list of the Capital Improvements she made while holding office as President. They are:

- 1. Addition of ten new 50-amp RV spots (we raised right around \$3000 by selling "options" on RV spots for a 5- or 10-year period MY IDEA and this pretty much took care of the expense of installation of the new spots
- 2. Replacement of the fencing on the south side of Arena 1
- 3. New holding tank for the water system (as the old silver tank was leaking this was the only thing I did NOT get prior approval of the Officers before I spent the money to replace there was water leaking in a stream from the tank and I had no choice but to fix it and then tell the Officers about it)
- 4. Dirt work on the RV area and addition of rock on the drive for easier access
- 5. Replacement of almost a third of the existing wooden bleacher seats with metal as the wooden ones are rotting and dangerous
- 6. Replacement of the old water tank with two new bladder tanks
- 7. Pavilion was covered
- 8. Repainted the interior of the concession stand and installed new countertop material.
- 9. Repainted the interior of announcer's stand at Arena 1.
- 10. Dug out the PILES of dirt at the west end of Arena 2 and piled up around the "out" gate of Arena 2. Also moved dirt from fence and pens area of Arena 1 toward the middle of the arena and to the "in" gate area to level the interior of the arena and to attempt to slow the erosion under the large gate on the south/west side of Arena 1.

Donna negotiated with the NARC to "host" their Finals. Instead of getting the normal arena rental fee of \$400 plus \$5 off of each stall and RV hookup that we normally got, Donna negotiated the deal where the AASP would do the make ready (mowing, weed eating, etc) of the ground and supply the tractors and drivers to drag the arena during the playday. IN RETURN, we STILL got the \$400 arena rental, but got ALL the monies from the stall rental and the RV space rental as well as the concession stand. This was an increase in income for that event in the neighborhood of \$1300 for

the weekend. Donna did NOT ask for ANY help (though several people pulled in early and helped her in the end) and she not only mowed the area and did all the weed eating around the arenas, but also did ALL the stalls and RV spots....which I do not believe has been done since.

Donna (in response to a request from Billy Privett) was also responsible for the CMSA shooters coming to the grounds and the Bikers for Christ using the grounds for their annual event. Donna began the barrel races which, had the Officers not dropped the ball, would have brought in quite a bit of money during 2011 (they can dispute it if they want, but we did quite well at the very first one even with the "not so perfect" weather conditions and brought in something like \$400 if memory serves me).

Donna had been in contact with the GNHA playday association in Oklahoma with the idea of them holding some of their events at our grounds. (They are a large playday association in Oklahoma that was actually a splinter group FROM the AASP&RC years ago when a President and Treasurer absconded with all Association funds – this association had those people as their founding members – Google Grand National Horsemen's Association and check out their rulebook and you will see their rulebook mirrors the AASP&RC in most aspects)

Donna had been working on getting team sortings, pennings, ropings and youth rodeos started at the grounds. Her thought for all of this additional activity was to let OTHERS pay for our fun. In this economy and given that there are so many more things for people to do these days that are less expensive in the long run (as we all know, horses are NOT cost effective!), I do not believe a playday group can survive in and of itself based solely on dues from its membership and a couple of events per year. If we are to grow and improve, we have to have outside monies or we stagnate and eventually the organization will die.

Donna had planned to discuss covering Arena 1 during 2012 and had tentative plans to present her plan to the membership for ways to pay for this project. With a covered arena, there would be even more benefits to us as an organization and would make it all the more attractive for outside organizations to want to lease our facilities for their own events resulting in greater income revenue.

Donna initiated the ad incentive program whereby members could sell ads in order to help defray their expenses for the events. We raised over \$2500 with members selling ads for that year alone – NOT including what the Princesses were required to sell as part of that program. (I might add, GARY LEIPSIC ALONE sold \$2000 worth of those ads and he did NOT accept the "prize" at the end of the year for selling the most dollar amount of ads, which was a prepaid debit card. Gary refused to accept the card from the Association). I do not believe there have been as many ads sold since that time either....and certainly not in that amount. Yeah, sound like a couple of no good swindlers to me (NOT!!!)...what do you all think?!?!
