Executive Board Meeting; January 16, 2011

Meeting called to order by President Donna Leipsic at 9:40 am.

Credentials Chair Jeton Tumlinson called roll.

President Donna updated everyone on Region 3 VP Donna Rust's condition as she has been in the hospital and is recuperating from a respiratory infection at home. She also explained that Awards Chair Becky Rhodes was absent due to foot surgery she had last Friday.

Jeton stated that there are 21 voting members present.

Eric Savage gave the invocation.

Motion made by Ronnie Elrod to dispense with the reading of the Minutes from previous Executive Board meeting. Seconded by Tommy McEwen. Motion carried.

Donna reported that the balance on hand December 31, 2010 was \$8,030.21.

We do not have an Audit Chair at this time, but Donna hopes to have one in place soon. Kelli Parr will be handling the financial statements in the future. Junior Oates requested that the individual charges on the debit card be broken down to a greater extent on the financial statements.

Spring Roundup Chair Wes Moody was not present. Donna reported that she and Wes had discussed having a 4-D barrel race on Friday and a team playday on the Saturday. There will be a dinner and dance Saturday evening. We are going to try a team sorting on Sunday, April 17 instead of a trail ride. Events will be open to anyone. SRU will be April 15, 16 and 17. Discussion regarding the SRU trail ride. Other options for scheduling a trail ride were presented and we will try to work one in around another event later in the year; suggestion of having it at Charmie's house the weekend before Finals.

Donna reported that she has created two new Chair positions.

Daniel Leipsic has been named as Scholarship Chair. He is not present today, but will have a program ready to present to the Officers in the near future. Donna outlined his thoughts that the scholarship award should be based on such things as academics, knowledge of the Association history and operating procedures, an essay and extracurricular activities. He feels very strongly that the judges for this contest should be from outside the Association.

Misty Martin has been named as Special Events Chair. This committee will cover all new events and events that are not specifically covered under current committees such as barrel races, ranch rodeos, roping, sorting, youth rodeos and so forth.

Queen Lauren arrived and was introduced.

Misty discussed her ideas of events to have at the grounds. Cal Bowman is going to assist with the events concerning cattle. Our first ranch rodeo is set for April 30. There was discussion regarding advertising the new events. We have also scheduled two clinics this spring. We will host the Mike & SherryLynn Johnson Roping/Barrel Clinic on March 5 & 6. We will also host a Lynn McKenzie Barrel Clinic on May 21 & 22. Information was given on both clinics which is on the website and in the Riders Roundup.

The decision of whether or not the concession will be opened during all the special events will be left to Kathy Whatley and Janice Blahuta as Concession Co-Chairs.

Misty is talking to suppliers for cattle and believes that we can get cattle from between \$12 - \$15 per head.

Convention Chair Loretta Jeter reported that after Region 3 had a meeting to discuss Convention that she would report back to the Officers with possible sites and itinerary.

Riders Roundup Stephani Foltz reported that the Riders Roundup continued to grow in size. It was difficult for her to email it out to everyone as it had to go out in several parts and that often it took her all day to get it to everyone. She would like to send it to LaDonna to put on the website and have everyone access it via the website. The members that are still receiving it by U S Mail would continue to receive it this way. Once LaDonna gets it up on the website, Stephani will send all members a copy of the financial statements each month as the Riders Roundup on the website does not contain this information.

Rules Chair Larry Mitchell suggests that we have a naming contest for the event to be brought into the event rotation in 2012 at Playday Finals this year. He suggests that this contest be for Juniors or below and that there be 3 – 5 judges that choose the name for the new event after contestants have submitted their suggestions. He suggests that the contest be on Wednesday of PDF and the results be announced on Friday and a prize to be awarded for the person that submitted the winning name.

Parade Chair Jackie Dunlap asks that anyone that participated in the Ft Worth Parade send their parade forms to her. Also if your group rides at San Angelo or any other parade, make sure to get their forms in to be considered for the year-end awards. The parade forms are available in the Rulebook.

IT Chair LaDonna Mild reports that the website has changed a bit and she has tried to make it more user friendly with lots of additional information. She asks that everyone send their information and pictures via the webmaster links and she will get it added to the website. It was requested that LaDonna look into creating an Association Facebook page.

LaDonna also reminded us that if you utilize the PayPal feature from the website, please print off the receipt to present with the necessary paperwork to your club/district secretary so Peggy can track the PayPal payments. There was additional discussion regarding other additions that are planned for the website in the future.

Credentials Chair Jeton Tumlinson has nothing to report.

Promotions Chair Eric Savage outlined his ideas for benefitting five individual charities during the year, one at each Association event throughout the year. He proposes that we earmark funds raised at these events as follows:

Spring Roundup - Scottish Rite Hospital

PDF - AASP&RC Needy Family Fund

50/50 - SpiritHorse Therapudic Center

Fall Roundup - Intrepid Fallen Heroes Fund

Convention - Susan G Komen

Ronnie Elrod motions to accept the proposal as set out by the Promotions Chair above. Seconded by Varsi. Motion carried.

Eric also proposes a saddle raffle to raise monies to benefit our scholarship fund. Motion to accept this proposal by Ronnie Elrod. Second by LaDonna Mild. Motion carried.

Eric requested advertising budget. Discussion regarding cost of advertising. Suggestion that decision on this be left up to the Officers.

Concession Co-Chairs Kathy Whatley and Janice Blahuta are going to meet with Donna in the next few weeks to check the concession stand and make up a list of things they would want to have for the concession stand. We need a soda fountain. There was discussion on how to get workers to volunteer to work in the concession stand as we are having a lot more events at the grounds this year.

10 minute break

Credential Chair Jeton Tumlinson called role. There are now 23 voting members present.

Scrapbook Chair Leslie O'Brien stated that she will place a letter in the Riders Roundup regarding scrapbook entries for Convention.

Donna outlined proposal for Horse Show/Fall Roundup. It has been suggested that this event is to now be called Fall Roundup. It would consist of a combination of Horse Show with additional events. The proposal calls for a barrel race on Friday night Sept 16, followed on the morning of Sept 17 @ 9 with an horse show with all classes (except speed); then at 4pm that afternoon we will have an open buckle show. If you ride in Horse Show only the cost would be \$30; riding only in the buckle show would cost \$30; if you ride in both the cost will be \$50. Sunday we would have Queen's breakfast, cowboy church and anything additional on Sunday afternoon that we chose. Motion to accept changing "Horse Show" to "Fall Roundup" by Varsi Klatzkin, second by Kyle Harrison, motion carried.

KD stated she will be working with Eric for promotion and also to make additional funds if needed for awards.

Donna reported that she has discussed 50/50 with the NARC people and this is the date that we have come up with. There was discussion regarding alternate dates, but if we go with most anything else, we tend to not draw their members to ride.

Donna presented proposed awards budget from Becky Rhodes. She is asking for a total of \$26,660.00. This is an increase over last year due to possible price increases of awards. There was discussion regarding costs and numbers of the awards, our entry fees and the extra activities to generate additional funds. Specifics were given regarding what we paid last year and our expectations this year. Our bank balance on January 31 of 2010 was \$21,456.00. The participation awards for Finals (caps and visors) were not dated so they are available for use this year as well. Same situation with our ribbons as they are not dated nor did they have the event on them, so we will be able to fill in our ribbons this year. There was discussion regarding income/expenses at PDF. A motion to accept the awards budget was made by Michael Wheeler. Seconded by Jeton Tumlinson. Motion carried.

There was discussion regarding ad incentives and how many people participated. The ad incentive information will come out in the Riders Roundup next month.

Discussion regarding the Queen's proposal was tabled until the end of the meeting.

Donna reported that we were clear regarding all of our IRS issues. We are current with the IRS at this time.

Ronnie Elrod announced his plans for a Stick Horse Barrel Race on Tuesday night before PDF. Region 1 will sponsor this event for children 5 years and under (as of their birthday). They will give a Corriente 10" barrel saddle for the winner and a buckle for second. The Association will not have any cost and will not make any money. \$10 entry fee, 2 runs, fastest time counts.

Ronnie would also like to see some sort of display for historical memorabilia regarding the Association. Things on display would include old vests, old Riders Roundups and other items from years past.

The "revamp" of the Officer's uniforms is still a work in progress.

Donna reported on her efforts to contact the Grand National Horseman's Association to generate arena use and possible membership and participation. Michael would like to see us look into a nationwide playday event as there are playday organizations throughout the country. This might could be accomplished utilizing sponsorships and would be along the lines of the NFR. There was discussion regarding this idea.

Regarding insurance, the Officers decided to let the spectator insurance lapse. The premium is \$1400 per year. Donna explained coverage provided by this insurance. There was discussion regarding different types of coverages we might have. The spectator insurance is event specific. There was discussion that Lewisville Saddle Club has general liability insurance coverage and they will supply us the contact information so we can look into the coverage they have. Donna reported on possible insurance on the buildings and the ongoing search for this type of coverage. It was left to the Officers to investigate the insurance issue. We will look into additional signage for the grounds. Move to table the insurance question by Jim Tumlinson. Second by Ronnie. Motion carried.

We will set a work day, probably in March.

Donna reported on the outcome of the discussions from the Queen's committee and outlined the different proposals that were put forth and the points of each. There were two basic proposals regarding selection of the Queen: (1) to go from PDF to PDF and select and crown the Queen at PDF and (2) the Duchess program where we will select a Duchess at PDF and crown her at Convention. There was also discussion regarding the recommendation by the committee to sever the scholarship from the Queen's contest and open the scholarship to all Intermediates. Donna also outlined the Princess program for the younger girls to begin participating in the royalty programs. There was discussion that the new program would not be implemented until 2012. Additional discussion regarding different forms of the contest to be implemented was had.

Ronnie Elrod suggested that the new Queen's program will not begin until 2012 but the Princess program will begin in 2011. Discussion. Motion made by Ronnie (with the assistance of Diana Johnson) as follows: that the Queen's contest should crown the new Queen at Playday Finals 2012 and implement the Princess program (clarification on Princess we are talking about the small girls not the Region Princess, Junior classes and down) to begin at SRU 2011. Motion seconded by Jackie Dunlap. More discussion. Question called by Tommy McEwen. Motion carried. Programs will be brought up again at Convention for vote on final form.

Garland Hargis motioned to adjourn. Seconded by Ronnie Elrod. Motion carried.


