
## **Rider's Roundup chair**


I want to thank the Association for electing me as Executive VP. I will do my very best to represent the Association and its members. I will always try to do what is best for the Association.

Sounds like the Association will be having a great 2014 and Region 6 District 5 members will be in on all the fun.





Just remember I'm here praying, and*


*God will do the rest.*
