(\*\*Begging going on here...LOL!) They run on Saturday and Sunday and finish up with Team Events on Monday. We still have Fall Roundup ahead (SEPTEMBER 16,17,18th) and I want to THANK KD for having everything ready to go! I'm really excited about this new format as Horseshow Finals has lost some of it's popularity as a whole, but "I" still enjoyed it as much as any of our functions, in fact, my favorite! Please make the effort to come support Fall Roundup this year!!!

As of this writing, we have less than 7 weeks till Convention (OCTOBER 14,15) and Loretta has this totally under control for us. THANK YOU Loretta!!! \*\*May I REMIND you that as I am sure you are aware at this time that you have intentions on attending, to PLEASE LET US KNOW PRIOR TO OCTOBER 1st, in order that we have an accurate accounting of how many meals need to be ordered and have prepared adequate seating for PLEASE send in those everyone!!! registration forms or at least call Peggy or myself to let us know that you plan on attending!!! Also, if you have anything that you would like the rest of us to have a "heads up" on for discussion and would like to make things easier for Convention, I am still requesting topics for discussion to put on the agenda. I have a few things already sent in and I will address those below.

One thing I want to notify you of is that during the weekend prior to the Shooters being at the grounds, the A/C in the Concession Stand bit the dirt! Kathy, Bailey and Gabby worked the entire weekend of the Shoot not only by themselves, but without the benefit of A/C! Kathy...you and your family have been a tremendous blessing to me this entire year!!! I want you to know how very much dedication means to and vour me Association!!! THANK YOU!!!! I was informed that we had the A/C checked out and the Compressor was finished. We got several bids for repairs and some of those were beyond the absurd!

After giving the Officers 4 choices of what options were available to us, it was decided that the best option and the most affordable option just happened to be one in the same: Gene Montgomery with the help of Don McEwen are replacing the entire A/C unit for less than repairs to the old unit would cost us! GIANT THANK YOU to you guys!!!!

Now, for the Convention topics that I have received are as follows:

- 1. It was brought to my attention that there are multiple issues with the Rulebook and I suggest if there is anything near and dear to your heart that you have found issue with, that you seek those out and have your recommendations ready to go. I've been informed there is believed to be stuff missing that is believed to be wanted back in. Also, that there are issues with out of date rules that need to be revised. Please, everyone, look over the Rulebook and see if you can find other things so that going forward, we have the best Rulebook to work with as possible.
- 2. It was brought to my attention that we might need a little more clarification on what to do with Mares/Foals and what was suggested is that we address the "NO 2 horses" in a stall to exception being Mare/Foal. Also suggested was to address "NO extension of stalls" to exception being Mare/Foal. Also that if these exceptions were allowed, that we make it where these exceptions are ONLY allowed on the back side of the back row of barns in order that these exceptions would be in the least problematic locations. That the extensions would allow for NO more than 3 panels and when bringing a Mare/Foal the Foal must be 5 months or younger and you must notify the Office that you are in need of this special circumstance when requesting stalls in order to be placed in the correct location.
- 3. It was brought to my attention that we are in need of revising our current policy and operations regarding work days at PDF. (Agreeably, we have a few rather large Districts that are able to utilize most, but not all of their members when signing up for the work schedules and some of the Districts are so small they must utilize all of their members, blend with other Districts and all those being utilized must work the entire day and still not have enough members to cover the schedules adequately.) What has been suggested is that we have individual sign ups for work schedules when signing up for PDF and if you don't work, your points don't count. I believe there will be more information to come on this as we get closer to Convention.

#### NAME THE GAME

The AASPRC is having a contest to name the new game that will take the place of Bowtie next year. The contest is open to all juniors, pee-wee and super pee-wee members. Please, parents and older siblings, this needs to be their idea.

**Race description:** The rider crosses the timer line either to the right or left set of poles. Rider goes on the outside of the first pole, inside the second, outside the third. Going around the barrel, rider proceeds to the second set of poles, going outside the first, inside the second and outside the third and crosses the finish.

**Equipment required:** Six (6) standard poles; one (1) 55 gallon barrel w/ pad

Measurements: First pole is thirty (30) feet from starting line

Poles are thirty (30) feet between each going down the arena

Poles are sixty (60) feet apart across the arena

Barrel is centered in the pattern and thirty (30) feet vertically


