Not only does this child have limited communication as it is but he is also from Sweden so this presents even more of a challenge. Through a series of coincidences that I now know God's hand was in all along he came to ride with Eric twice a week on my old horse T.J. Over time Eric and I discussed that he might like to try to playday as he cannot engage in regular sports at school. I got off of T.J so Martin could ride and my husband lovingly gave up his horse for me to ride and is now looking for something else to ride since what we had for him didn't work out. Now the "spoiled brat only child" in me didn't want to get off of TJ but I did it anyway and it is one of the most rewarding things I have ever done. Even though he cannot communicate it I can see the light of "I get to ride this horse" in his eyes each time we get that old bay horse out of the pasture. "I get to ride a horse" something I think some of us have lost. I think that at times we take it for granted and think this is something that we have to take care of or something that we have to attend. When Martin attended his first playday ever on February 19th, I was busy holding a region meeting and talking to people as I needed to but as I watched him get on T.J. I heard this little squeal and it was his excitement to be riding.

On that day he only did one pattern correctly but it didn't matter, every person within earshot of the arena clapped for him. Everyone was willing to help him try to get through the pattern. Later I was upstairs announcing and I wanted to get him his ribbons. I had to dig them out of a dusty box in a corner of the announcer stand. I didn't think a lot of it at the time but when they were in his hand, those little ribbons that none of us that have been at this a while care about any longer might as well have been gold. My grandma even saw him kiss his ribbon. He also kisses TJ on a regular basis. The next day we saw Martin and he still had one of those ribbons with him.

That being said given our current situation I was thinking if we all had the attitude of this little boy of "I get to ride" how much better off would we be? I know people with horses that have nobody to ride with. Not only do we get to ride, we get to have lifelong friends, and kiddos still hanging out with their parents and grandparents when they are in their 30's and married. Some are even raising their own kids in this organization.

At the executive board meeting on February **26th** Ι saw people conversations that have not spoken in 6 years visiting like nothing had ever happened between them. It is my sincere prayer that we can all pull together to take care of the business at hand no matter our personal feelings toward anything or anyone. No matter how big or how small a contribution you can make it is for the betterment of this association and for us all. Maybe we need not worry so much about how nice a meal we are going to eat at Spring Round-Up or what the participation award is going to be at Playday Finals or whatever else we can worry about and just remember that we GET to be here and since we GET to be here let's all be friends and help one another.



Care deeply,


Speak kindly..... And leave the rest to GOD!




