

If at any time you have an issue needing to be addressed, have questions that I can answer, or have an idea that I probably haven't thought of, I would LOVE to hear from you.



AASPERC PRINCESS PROGRAM

The Princess Program is to make possible for any girls that would like to participate to be allowed, to ready all participants for hopefully becoming a future AASP&RC Queen or Queen's Contestant, to work together for the betterment of the AASP&RC.

1.) Does NOT matter whether there are 1,2,10 or 30, as long as they want to participate, they will NOT be turned away if they can meet the following commitments/requirements.

2.) We do NOT select "A" Princess, we offer up this title to any and/or all girls 7 - 14 years of age. (Girls may be a Princess as many years as they wish to participate and are able to renew their entry fees each year.)

3.) There is a \$50.00 entry fee to every girl that wishes to participate and they will fill out an entry form. This entry fee will be attached to the entry form.

4.) The AASP&RC will furnish each Princess with an Official Princess sash and hatband. (This is why we require an entry fee, so it does NOT cost the Association to provide these items)

5.) The Princesses will abide by a simple dress code that requires them to wear a long sleeve western shirt, jeans, belt, boots and western hat anytime they are wearing their sash and/or working their scheduled work list. At all other times, they may wear this Princess uniform if they wish, but is NOT required.

6.) Princesses sign up at or before Spring Roundup. At the dinner of Spring Roundup they are introduced as the Queen's Court. (Will have a 1 minute or less introduction prepared to tell everyone their name, age, city/town of residence and a little bit about themselves. Basically a mini speech.)

7.) They will get a ceremony of installation the first night of Playday Finals.

Gerald passed away Monday, February 21, 2011 in Brownfield.
He was born June 23, 1936 in Paducha to Robert Hampton and Myrtle Kincannon Goldston. He graduated from Brownfield High School. He was in the Navy Reserves after WWII.

He married Theresa Stephens in Brownfield. She now lives in Austin.

Gerald then married Patty Sue Durham Rimer on June 5, 1992 in Post. He farmed most of his life and later was a Terry County employee. He was a member of Immanuel Baptist Church.
