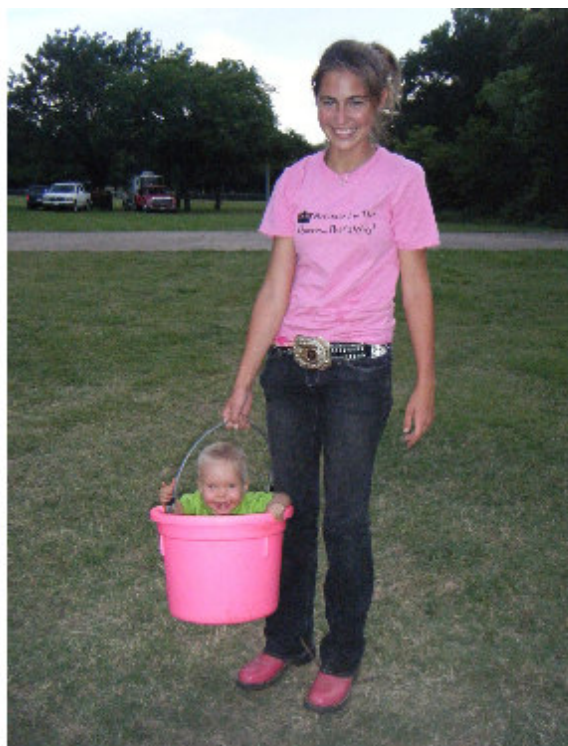

Hey Ya'll,

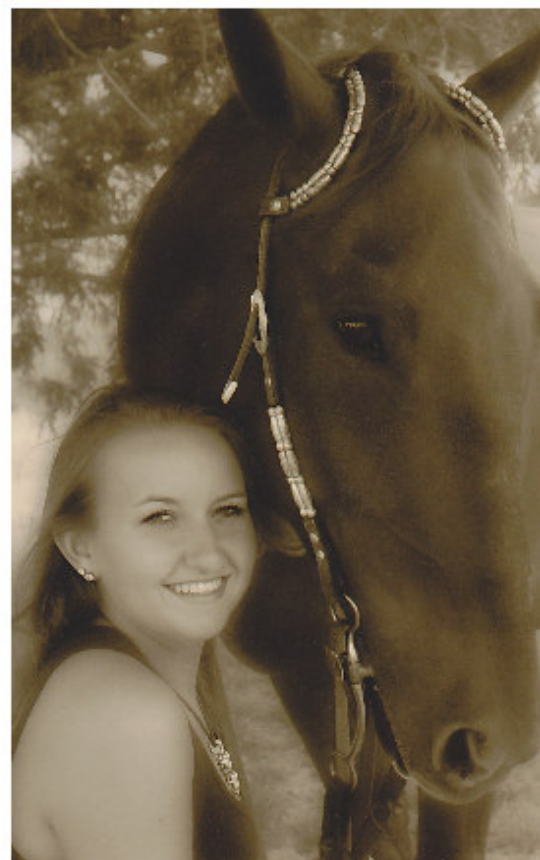
