Just to bring you up to speed:

.....We have been contacted by a group hoping to put on an event the weekend of November 12. I am meeting with them next week to discuss the details, but am happy to see that yet another group has decided to utilize our grounds for their function!

.....We replaced the booster pump in the well house right before the NARC Finals. The booster pump is the little pump that pumps the water from the storage tanks into the pressure tanks. Our system is now in fine shape and working well.

.....I contacted Wise Electric regarding disconnecting several of the meters at the grounds as a cost-cutting measure. At this writing, 5 of the 7 meters that supply service to the RV spots have been disconnected. Currently, I have left the RV meter that is farthest to the west by the tractor shed on so if we have anyone that wants to stay at the grounds during Convention or before that time, they may do so. The meter to the new 50-amp spaces is under a 2-year contract, so we cannot disconnect that meter until that contract is fulfilled. I have also disconnected the two meters that supply power to Arena 2. As a result, 7 of the 12 meters on the property have been disconnected, for which we will realize a savings of \$175 per month (considering they cost us \$25 per month base charge).

.....There has been a suggestion that some might not want to stay at the hotel in Wichita Falls for Convention and would rather bring a trailer to the grounds and commute to the hotel from there. As stated above, there is still one set of spaces with 30-amp service that is still available as well as the new line of 50-amp services. We will leave 30-amp meter on through Convention so that anyone desiring to stay at the grounds rather than in the hotel will be able to do so. Cost will be the standard \$15 per night for a 30-amp space and \$20 per night for the 50-amp space. Please let me know if you are planning on doing this so that I can show you which plugs will be available for use.

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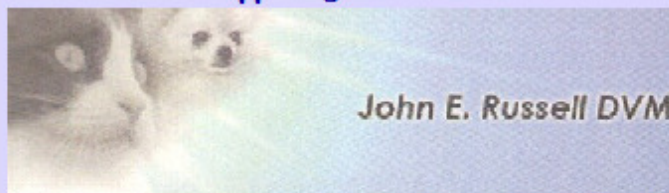
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
